### **LD: Foundations - Session ID: 458306**

The training is scheduled to open October 19, 2021. Anyone needing to enroll after the opening date of the training, must contact Wendy Bryant, Disabilities and Online LD Coordinator, at [wendy@aalrc.org](mailto:wendy@aalrc.org). Participants are responsible for completing the training before the closing date which is one month from date training opened. This is a self-paced online course available through LINCS (<https://lincs.ed.gov/>) and Canvas. Participants will need an account in both platforms.

This training will cover the basics of Learning Disabilities as it relates to the adult education population and will also help clarify items often misunderstood in the learning disabilities community. Participants must complete each of the 6 modules under the 'Disabilities and Equitable Outcomes' section of *Learning to Achieve* (for a total of 7.5 hours of credit). Each module will provide its' own certificate – a total of 6. A copy of all 6 certificates must be forwarded to Wendy Bryant as proof of completion. Registered participants will be provided details on how to submit documentation, prior to the start of the course.
