

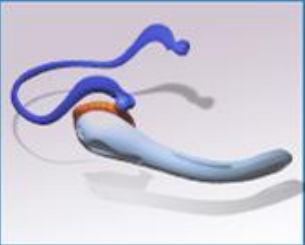

A small, digital tape recorder used to record steps of a task. Great for job tasks in sequence or solving math problems. Push "1" to hear Step 1; "2" to hear Step 2; and so on.

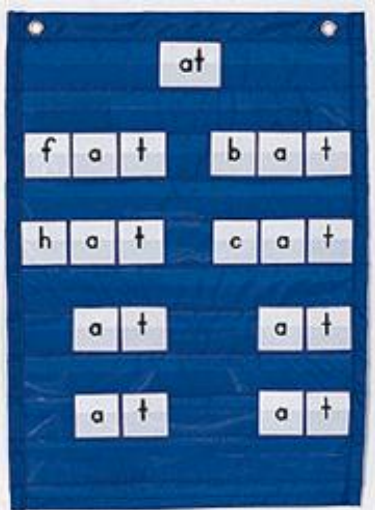

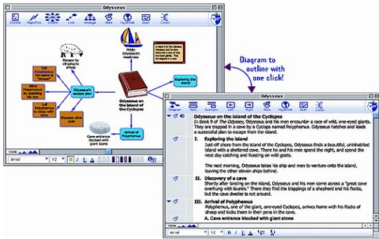
