SUBJECT: Professional Development/Training Opportunity

As part of the 2020-2023 Request for Proposal (RFP), each adult education and literacy council provider must have a Career Coach or a Career Service Provider (CSP) on staff to assist students in transitioning into the workplace and post-secondary education or training. LaTasha Dale, Career Coach for the Division of Workforce Services, Adult Education Section, will be the presenter for the course. The Fall 2023 training is scheduled for September 12, 2023 – December 12, 2023. There are required face-to-face meetings on September 12, October 17-18, and November 28, 2023.

Participants who complete this course become qualified Career Service Providers. This training is provided through the AALRC and is open to all current local adult education programs. Travel expenses for participants will be paid through the AALRC by state adult education travel guidelines, except for **SNAP E&T Coordinators, OSY Job Placement Coordinators, and TANF Career Coaches. Travel for these individuals will be reimbursed through the program's local budgets.** Once participants have been selected, all approved applicants will be forwarded an escWeb Session ID.

Applicants must submit a:

- Career Services Provider Application Form
- Resume
- Personal Statement on why you would like to become a CSP and how you plan to utilize the skills (between 200-250 words, double-spaced with 12-point font)

The required documents should be emailed to Dr. Shelia Wilkerson at <u>shelia@aalrc.org</u> and must be **received** by close-of-business **August 18, 2023.** Any applications received after the deadline will not be considered for this session.
